My MPhil, PhD, and research fellowship topics were, respectively, 'The introduction of clinical teaching to Cambridge', 'Scientific medicine and the medical sciences in Cambridge, 1851-1939', and 'The tension between science and medicine: biochemistry in Cambridge and Paris, 1914-1950'. The first two theses form the basis of my monograph entitled *Gentlemen, Scientists, and Doctors*. Work based on my PhD and my research fellowship appeared in *Medical History*.

I have given papers at Wellcome Units for the History of Medicine in Cambridge, Manchester, Glasgow, and University College, London, and at conferences in Glasgow, Maastricht, Paris (Cité des Sciences et de l'Industrie) and Zaragoza (XIXth International Congress of the History of Science).
